

REDI-supported trainees will acquire nonacademic skills for success, such as science communications; intellectual property; regulatory affairs; science policy; consulting; drug discovery, approval, and production; and the business of science, science education, and health care. Participants from diverse backgrounds are particularly encouraged.

### Continuity and Retention Supp: NOT-OD-20-054/055

- Increase your own award budget to support your own retention and minimize departures from biomedical research workforce during critical life events
- Also available for Career Development Awards
